Hillsborough—issues of justice need persistence

The summer is a good time to catch up on reading and I managed to get through some really interesting books. The first was Phil Scraton's Hillsborough: The Truth, which describes the long and painful journey of the bereaved families after the disaster in which 96 men, woman and children were killed at the FA Cup semi final in 1989. The author was part of the Independent Panel in 2012 that through intensive research and testimony led to the new inquest that gave the verdict that the 96 were unlawfully killed. The book describes the appalling way in which the bereaved families were treated in the days following the disaster, alongside the manipulation of the facts to place the blame on the supporters and most powerfully the determination of the families to achieve justice. The book end with a poem entitled "Their Voices will be heard."

Shattered by loss but unbroken in spirit
In the face of injustice you never backed down
You forced them to listen, you sacrificed your lives,
You bore witness with dignity on the day of reckoning
And their voices, your voices, have been heard

By way of contrast I also read a book by an old college friend called Nigel Leaves, entitled **Religion under Attack**. He outlines in a comprehensive way the reasons religious faith is being questioned, undermined and rejected. He describes the philosophical objection that in a scientific age it is hard to accept the idea of a supernatural deity who created and watches over the world. It is an uncomfortable and challenging book and after reading the book on Hillsborough it made me think about issues of truth and justice from a faith perspective.

Perhaps the first thing that is evident in Scraton's account is that justice was only achieved by the tireless efforts of many people to get to the truth and their refusal to be intimidated and broken by the equally determined resistance of organisations to cover up the facts. relation to faith it is a helpful reminder that prayer does not involve sitting back and leaving everything to God, but issues of justice require persistence and the tireless effort of people of goodwill. Maybe one of the problems about talking about the supernatural is that can give the impression that God is removed from the world and may or may not intervene. The Hillsborough book made me think that God is more likely to be found in the struggles and longings of ordinary people. The Anglican Cathedral in Liverpool is an impressive sight and was the place where the Independent Panel issued its groundbreaking report and represents a witness to how God stands alongside the bereaved families. The words of Isaiah have a continuing relevance: "learn to do good; seek justice, correct oppression; bring justice to the fatherless, plead the widow's cause." (1.17)



Turning water into wine (John 2, verses 1-12)

This is the story of Jesus' first recorded miracle. Jesus was no 'sober sides'. He happily went to a wedding party, and when the excellent wine ran out, he readily turned water, stored in large jars, into wine. It supplied over 100 gallons of wine superior to the original provision. It was shared out among many people who had come to the party from nearby locations. We are not told that they got drunk, but perhaps they were good at holding their drink. It was a merry occasion.

John calls this miracle a 'sign'. It spoke of the superiority of Jesus over all the marvellous things that God had done in the past.

As the Epistle to the Hebrews puts it: God had inspired many wonderful acts, largely carried out by

prophets like Elijah and Elisha, who even raised people from the dead. Their prophecies, hidden in literal happenings, also had a symbolic meaning. THE prophet whom God intended to send in fulfilment of his coded promises would exhibit his greatness and enable repentant sinners to be forgiven and enter eternal life.

The story is one of many in the Old Testament which in a strange way foreshadow the whole mission of Jesus, which would give real life to people who believed in him. The New Testament gives the fulfilment of these hints and promises, which Jesus and the Apostles frequently referred to as they taught the gospel.

bringing me from London to Northchurch to meet David and Lilly. We had many years of wonderful family times together, exploring the neighbourhood and chatting about our family. Lilly worked for Elizabeth (Lavender) Loxley at her beautiful home in Dudswell. I visited there several times, meeting this charming lady and admiring the beautiful tapestries she sewed.

All these dear people are dead now, but I am so glad to renew my association with Northchurch by attending musical events at St. Mary's, as I now live in Hemel Hempstead.

The recent "Sing Gloria" was a marvellous musical experience – good teaching of performance skills, great musicianship and friendliness, and wonderful food!

THE GREAT WAR 1914 - 1918

The Battle of the Somme

Part 2

On 1st September 1916 the fighting on the Somme entered its third month. Following the enormous losses on the first day the British had regrouped and had slowly begun to push the Germans back.

Newly trained troops arriving from England and Reserves were moved

up to the front to make up for the earlier losses. Three of these men came from Northchurch – Joseph Aldridge, William Sibley and Walter Welling.

Joseph Aldridge was born in 1887 and was a keen footballer. Enlisting with the Bedfordshire Regiment in 1915 Joseph was later transferred to 11th Battalion, Northumberland Fusiliers to make up for earlier casualties. On 24th September Joseph was killed whilst taking part in an assault on the German lines near Martinpuich.

William Sibley was a gardener who moved to Northchurch to work and enlisted in December 1915 just before the introduction of conscription. On 22nd June 1916 he married

Nora Moore in St Mary's and soon after left for France. William was killed on 26th September whilst serving with 6th Battalion, Northamptonshire Regiment during the battle to capture the area around Thiepval.

Born in Northchurch in 1891, Walter Welling worked as a labourer. He enlisted in November 1915 and two months later whilst still undergoing military training he married Kate Keen at Berkhamsted Registry Office. Walter remained in England until July 1916 when he was sent to the Somme. He was killed by German shellfire on 29th September whilst attacking a German strongpoint at Thiepval with 6th Battalion, Princess Charlotte of Wales's (Royal Berkshire Regiment).

Joseph Aldridge's and William Sibley's bodies were never recovered from the battlefield. Their names are consequently engraved on the Thiepval Memorial. Walter Welling's body now lies in the Communal Cemetery extension at Warloy-Baillon.
