Light in the Darkness

A few weeks ago there was a prayer vigil in St Mary's. It was very simple and in the space and quiet of the church people came in and lit a candle and offered their own prayers for refugees. In late September a meeting was held at St Peter's in Berkhamsted to discuss the situation and a commitment was made to support financially the work of the aid agencies and to encourage the council to consider offering a safe haven to a number of refugee families. The main impetus for action in the local community has come from the grassroots. A Facebook page: "Berkhamsted for Refugees" has been set up that outlines the imaginative ways that local people have responded to the crisis. There have been collections of clothing and supplies, a scheme to use old laptops to be passed onto refugee families enabling them to contact home. It represents a timely reminder of the power of compassion and concern for people irrespective of faith and background.

I was reading a book (Timothy Radcliffe: What is the Point of Being a Christian?) a few weeks ago in which the author describes how in times of crisis the task of the church is not to give into fatalism. The sense that nothing can change or we have to accept things as they are. We do not have to adjust to the idea that war and poverty are inevitable or that the only response to violent actions is more violence. There are many people of all faith backgrounds who work together to build up a sense of common humanity rather dividing over their differences. Maybe it a sense that love, peace and compassion are simply attractive and it is better to build up rather than tear down. A local response to the refugee situation in the grand scale of things is a small gesture, but in the Bible small is beautiful. It is through small signs that in the words of the book "speak our hope that we open windows for God's transforming grace in the world."

Through the month of November we move closer to Advent and prepare for the Christmas celebrations. The dark evenings and shorter days are rich with symbolism. As a church we celebrate the message of eternity that the light shines in the darkness. Christians hope for eternity, but eternity starts now. My favourite quote from Radcliffe's book expresses this conviction: "Eternity begins whenever we share God's life. It breaks in whenever we overcome hatred with love. Hope means daring to let God's eternity break through the clouds now. To be hopeful is to live in this very present moment in which something can happen." Something always can and does happen. But it not preordained that it has to be bad.



This Month in



The *Bucks Herald* of 15th November 1902 contained a short article under the heading of "Unseasonal Fruit". It stated that Mr William Randall, the Sexton of St Mary's church, had picked half-a peck, about 4½ litres, of Victoria plumbs, on the 6th November from a tree in his garden whilst others were still not yet ripe.

At that time, William Randall ran a market garden in a two acre walled garden leased from the Diocese of St Albans behind the village school. It contained three large greenhouses, flower and vegetable beds, and fruit trees. The site of his market garden now forms the school playground / church car park.

William Randall was born in 1850, the son of James Randall, a gardener's assistant and Sexton at St Mary's church who lived at No6 New Road. After leaving school, William followed his father into the gardening profession. In April 1875, William married Rosetta Talbot at St Mary's church. Rosetta was the daughter of a nearby lockkeeper on the Grand Junction Canal. They went on to have seven children.

Over the years, William went on to build up his successful market garden business and was a founder member of the Berkhamsted Co-operative Society.

As well as earning a living from his market garden business, in 1892 William took over his father, James', role as Sexton at St Mary's; James Randall had been the Sexton there for the previous 20 years.

Apart from running his market garden, his work with the Berkhamsted Co-operative Society and his role as Sexton, William also founded and ran the first men's recreation room in Northchurch in the family home in New Road. He was also a keen bellringer.

In 1907, William Randall retired as President of the Berkhamsted Co-operative Society and was presented with an illuminated address, which read:

November 1902

"Mr William Randall, we the members of the Berkhamsted Co-operative Society Limited, desire to present you, on resignation of the Presidency, with a small token of our deep gratitude and affectionate regard. You were amongst the first founders of the Society and have been President for 20 years. Your unselfishness, your fearless uprightness, your patient forbearance have combined to triumph over many difficulties. We know that, come what may, we shall never have a wiser or a better President. We unite in the earnest and sincere prayer that you may enjoy, through all the closing years of life to a long deferred end, the happy knowledge that you, by your advice and example, have bestowed lasting benefit on your fellow men. January 1907"

A few years later William's health began to decline and he died in 1912. He was buried in St Mary's churchyard on 2nd September, his son, John, who had taken over as Sexton, digging his father's grave. John Randall also took over the running of the market garden business. The following year his fellow parishioners and friends raised enough money for a new stained glass window in St Mary's church. The inscription reads, "To the Glory of God and in memory of William Randall, 20 years Sexton of This Church, A Devout Christian and Faithful Friend, this Window is dedicated by his Fellow Parishioners and Friends. AD MCMXIII".

God the Creator

How do we come to exist and live on a wonderful planet? Some say things just happened magically, but I believe that a Supreme Being – God – started it all. Early in the Bible we read of God creating everything by His WORD of command. That WORD was embodied in a human being – Jesus. We look at him and begin to understand what God's character is like. If we read a little of the Bible every day, we will become aware of a divine influence which will give real meaning to our lives, in spite of the many puzzles which may confront us as we read. In the end, when God is 'all in all' (everything in everybody), believers will have a relationship with the Father and the Son which at present we can hardly imagine.



St Mary's Primary School News: October 2015



St Mary's School have had a busy month. Our Year 6 children have been to the fire stations at Hemel Hempstead and St Albans where they learnt about fire safety. The children thoroughly enjoyed their visit where they carried out team building exercises and were given a good insight into how a fire station worked. They felt the anticipation that the firemen could be called to an incident at any time. Thank you to Steve from Red Watch who answered all their questions.

Year 3 visited Berkhamsted Castle where the children had guided tours of the Motte and Bailey castle by local historians. They found out when and why the castle was built and were given a good idea of what it used to look like. The children's favourite part of the trip was pretending to be enemies, Normans and Anglo-Saxons and then shouting at each other from the top of the Motte and beyond the moat. They then walked down Castle Street and Berkhamsted High Street looking at the historical buildings.

Year 2 visited St Albans Cathedral as part of their R.E. topic on 'Signs and Symbols'. They walked around the Cathedral looking for Christian symbols. The children were able to show their learning by discussing what some of the symbols, such as the cross, candle and water represent. Some had the opportunity to dress up to tell the story of Alban, and others got to dress as a Bishop. The guides from the Education Centre commented on how well behaved and engaged the children were.

Our MacMillan Coffee Morning raised a staggering £418.08. Thank you to everyone who helped organise this event and to everyone who attended.

We had our Harvest Service in Church and after speaking with the children we have decided to build a wall of hope in School to help the children in Uganda. The children have each been given a brick to decorate and write prayers or words of hope.
