A potent resource for making sense of our existence

We have been having a review of the different things that happen at the church under the heading of the Mission Action Plan. This is all connected to the Living God's Love initiative in the Diocese of St Albans. This has three areas of "Going Deeper into God," "Transforming Communities," and "Making New Disciples." The aim of a Mission Action Plan is to explore the priorities for the church community in the years ahead with the three headings being useful as parameters.

At the heart of the Mission Action Plan is an invitation to go on a journey. It is possible that some folk can find faith through intellectual argument and discussion. This is important and whenever I preach a sermon it is never intended as the last word on a subject but more an ongoing conversation in which everyone should feel they can contribute or disagree. Courses that explore the Christian faith or Housegroups are a great way of looking in more detail at different parts of the Bible or a current issue and seeing how they might connect. There are many books and articles at the present time that are highly critical of religion and I enjoy a good debate on

showing that faith can have an intellectual integrity and resilience that can respond to some of the pressing issues that we face today in the world. Yet, there is, I think, a limit to what can be achieved by argument and discussion.

I read a really good book recently by Rupert Shortt called "God is No Thing: Coherent Christianity." He makes a good observation that "being a Christian should not entail assenting to six impossible propositions before breakfast, but doing things that change you." He elaborates by saying that "you don't think your way into a new way of living, but live your way into a new way of thinking." It is a different way of seeing things, but, represents an invitation to allow your heart and mind to be captured by a vision of love of God and neighbour. Shortt argues, Christianity "at its centre, the story of love's mending of wounded hearts, forms a potent resource for making sense of our existence." Whilst of course that is open to debate, the book offers a vision of life, in which I have found that the familiar can always seem new and what is tired has the capacity to become refreshed.












Do you ever read the Bible?

I fear only a small minority of British people do. The Bible seems irrelevant to their daily needs. Why read it then?

Because, though written down by humans, it conveys a meaning to our lives and portrays a God who will bring good out of the evil which seems to reign over our world.

The Bible records the good which is done by many humans, and the evil which is done by even more. If we read it, we shall get, often indirectly, the divine comment on life which will give us, among other things, a sense of the difference between right and wrong.

Jesus was the very image of God. If we want to understand God's character we must look at Jesus. While totally human, he represents God and can influence us to become more like God.

But perhaps you find this difficult to believe, and can be satisfied to move along through life 'making the best of a bad job'. Real life, according to the overall teaching of the Bible, resides in Jesus, and is bestowed on those who place themselves absolutely at his disposal. He gives light in place of darkness. The apostle Paul wrote to the Romans that sin pays a wage and the wage is death, but God gives us freely, if we have faith, eternal life in union with Christ Jesus (Romans 6, verse 23).

God is said to be love, and if we accept this 'nothing in all creation can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord' (Romans 8, verse 30). He later adds that if the confession 'Jesus is Lord' is on your lips and the faith that God raised him from the dead is in your heart, you will find salvation (Romans 10, verse 9). 'The same Lord is Lord of all and has riches enough for all who call on him. For everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved' (Romans 11).

Walter PURTON

7th Battalion, Bedfordshire Regiment

24th October 1916

Walter Purton was born towards the end of 1890 and grew up with two brothers and six sisters in a house in Northchurch High Street. His father, George Purton, came from Little Gaddesden whilst his mother, Elizabeth, was from Berkhamsted. The family later moved to Orchard End by which time Walter was working as a Chemical Worker at Cooper's factory in Berkhamsted.

In September 1914, Walter enlisted at Bedford with the 7th Battalion, Bedfordshire Regiment, otherwise known as the 'Shiny Seventh'. After completing his training, he was sent to France in July 1915. On 1st July 1916 Walter was part of the attacking force on the first day of the Battle of the Somme capturing a heavily fortified German strongpoint. After their success Walter's Battalion moved north to a quieter sector of the Front for a period of rest and front-line duties.

Walter returned to the Somme sector in September and helped capture another strongpoint at the end of the month, despite strong opposition. The following month Walter and the 'Shiny Seventh' took over a series of trenches that had previously been captured by two other British Battalions. Despite them being knee-deep in mud the Germans were determined to recapture their lost

trenches and launched a counterattack on 24th October. Walter Purton was killed during the German counterattack defending his trench. His body now rests in the Regina Trench Cemetery, near Courcelette village, his headstone simply reading, 'Rest in Peace'.

What's in a name?

Many of you will have noticed the building site near the bottom of New Road, where Wrights used to be, and may have wondered at the proposed name, **Chandler Mews**.

As well as being a local family (Jim Chandler is remembered on the War Memorial), a family called Chandler also lived at Drayton Parslow, in Buckinghamshire. This family have a strong musical connection to Northchurch! In 1651, Anthony Chandler cast four of the bells which still ring today in St Mary's church. (Actually, he cast five at that time, but the heaviest was recast by the Whitechapel foundry in 1834.)

Richard Chandler moved from Soulbury to become the village blacksmith and founded the bellfoundry in Drayton Parslow in 1635. Richard may have died fairly young, as his son Anthony was still a teenager when he inherited the business. The Northchurch bells are probably among the first cast by young Anthony. Find Drayton Parslow on the map (SP843286) and you will see it is about 14 miles (23km) away from Northchurch as the crow flies, with no direct roads. And in the mid-1600s what roads there were would not have been smooth tarmac! How did Anthony get 2 tons of bells from his foundry to St Mary's?

There might be a clue in the name of his village. Drayton derives from the old English meaning a 'farm where sledges are used', a sledge being easier than a cart for horses to manage on a hillside. I favour a second theory: Bell Lane is not far from the church. In the 17th century, many founders were itinerant, transporting their equipment and then casting 'on site'. Anthony was recasting the old bells out of the church, and wouldn't have wanted to cart (or sledge) 2 tons weight both to and from his foundry. There was plenty of wood surrounding old Northchurch – and today's gardeners will agree there is plenty of clay!

I ask you to reflect on Anthony Chandler's strength and skill. There was none of today's machinery for pouring molten metal, nor current technology to enable him to tune his bells. Generations of Northchurch residents have heard Chandler's bells over the last 365 years, and those same bells will continue to sound for generations to come.
