Inspiration for Lent

As Easter is late this year Ash Wednesday is on March 6th and this is the beginning of Lent. It is traditionally the time to give something up or focus on some of the variations that take place over the coming weeks such as the 40 Acts generosity challenge or the 40 acts of kindness. If you are looking for inspiration on how to mark the coming weeks, the 40 Acts challenge website puts the message of Lent across very powerfully:

"Institutions and injustices, poverty and powerlessness – these problems seem too big for simple, everyday generosity to fix and yet God calls us to live like Jesus did. Jesus didn't change culture by means of assimilation, he lived a radically different life; characterised by love and expressed in generosity. He gave his resources, his time and ultimately his life. He always noticed people's needs, stopping to help the physically and spiritually poor, and in doing so he changed the world. Following Jesus means being the church. And the church doesn't just meet, it acts." (www.40acts.org.uk)

I have been thinking about conversations with folk in the community and especially in regard to the things that we can carry around with us and which can easily weigh us down. This is something that impacts across the generations. We all have our own way of dealing with things but I was thinking whether there might be scope for setting up informal groups that might be able to provide support and friendship. be open once again on a Wednesday afternoon for puzzles and cake. On the radio I was listening to an idea that was something like "share the burden walks" that offered support to those who had been recently bereaved. Likewise, it does not have to be a walk as there are plenty of places to meet for cake and coffee/tea. Another thing that struck me was whether there was anyone who was bemused by technology or how to set it up as I'm sure there are good people who can help.

This month in 1909

Major Bevil Granville died, aged 75, at his Locknell Cottage home in Northchurch. Born in 1834 at Wellesbourne Hall, near Stratford-upon-Avon, Bevil was the first child of Bernard Granville, a wealthy local landowner, and his wife, Ann. In 1851, aged 17, after attending Sandhurst, Bevil purchased a Commission and travelled to Canada with 23rd Royal Welsh Fusiliers who were there on garrison duty. Three years later, the Royal Welsh Fusiliers formed part of the combined French and British army sent to the Crimean Peninsula in response to Russia's attempt to annex the states of Moldavia and Wallachia on the Black Sea coast. During the resulting war, Bevil fought at the Battles of Alma, Inkerman and the capture, after a long siege, of Sebastopol.

In 1857, Bevil and his regiment were sent to India where a mutiny against British rule had broken out. Taking part in the relief of Lucknow and other fighting against the insurgents, Bevil remained in India until the mutiny had been quashed. Returning to England, in 1859 Bevil, now a Captain, purchased Locknell Cottage in Northchurch. He later left 23rd Royal Welsh Fusiliers and became Adjutant to the Hertfordshire Rifle Volunteers. Marrying Alice

Wodehouse in 1865, Bevil would later become father to five daughters and one son. In 1885, Bevil resigned his Commission and became an honorary Major and he and his family were subsequently to play a full part in local village life. Becoming a JP, Bevil also represented Northchurch on Hertfordshire County Council. Alice Granville died in 1901.

After his funeral on 10th March 1909, Bevil's body was buried in St Mary's churchyard. The following year, a stained-glass window in his and wife's memory was unveiled in the aisle of the church. Designed and built by Kempe and W E Tower it bears the wheatsheaf and tower emblems, and depicts Mary and the baby Jesus with angels and shepherds.

Locknell 'Cottage', which actually had two dressing rooms, a dining and a drawing room, six bedrooms, stables and a coach house, a dedicated pew in St Mary's church, and whose land covered two acres between the High Street and the river, was later demolished and the land used for housing.

Black, white or mixed?

At the end of a long interview, a journalist recently asked John McDonnell MP a simple question: Winston Churchill – hero or villain? "Tonypandy - Villain", he replied, referring to a controversial incident in Wales in 1910. The outcry was predictable.

It was a silly question. Churchill was in politics for 60 years. There were plenty of mistakes along the way to becoming a great war leader. "Everybody said that I was the worst Chancellor of the Exchequer that ever was. I'm inclined to agree with them" he said of himself.

It is not just the yes-no choice that I do not like. Does John McDonnell's view on Churchill matter?

Most of us form opinions without much information. Often enough we do not even understand the issue. That is not a reason to keep quiet – if we only spoke when we were experts, the world would be a quiet place.

But I do believe in experts. I listen to my dentist and even ask my son about the computer. That does not stop me having opinions. I just have to be modest, to recognise my limitations – and to be prepared to learn from others.

The Christian view is that we all have marvellous potential, but we are flawed. We make mistakes; and we do many things that we have no cause to be proud of.

Jesus taught us to ask God to "forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us." As St Augustine said, this is the only line in the Lord's Prayer where we risk praying damnation on ourselves. We need to be forgiving of others.

There is a story about a girl who was being confirmed. "Are you a good girl or a bad girl?" asked the bishop. "Streaky" she answered.

I do not like the bishop's either-or question, but the answer was spot on.

Banking with a Heart

Several years ago Archbishop Welby drew attention to the vicious actions of some pay-day lenders who, profiting from the limited choices open to those who were hard up, lent them money at some thousand percent of interest. This got them out of trouble today but ensured they would be in heavy debt tomorrow. The Church should help, he declared, by supporting Credit Unions. Sadly it then appeared that Church investments were indirectly held in Wonga, one of the Lenders and the whole message got lost in media cries of 'hypocrisy'!

But the problem is still there; yet so are the Credit Unions. One of these, Dacorum First Credit Union (DFCU), is open to anyone who lives or works in Dacorum. Based in the Forum, Hemel Hempstead, it operates much like a bank, but not-for-profit. It is licensed by the authorities, run by volunteers, and you can join to invest or to borrow if you have the need. Borrowers pay interest on their loans at 1% per month, which amounts to a little over 12% per annum. You won't get a better rate anywhere else. Savers can expect to earn interest on the profits earned each year in

the form of a dividend. Last year this amounted to 0.5% - not quite top of the range, but a good deal more than you will get from an ordinary savings account with a High Street bank. And the more we deposit with them the more they can lend to our less fortunate neighbours.

They act with prudence. You have to show how you are going to repay your loan if you have one, and the amount you can borrow is related to how much you are saving each month. The more you save the more you may borrow, other things being equal. Saving is encouraged and they run Christmas Clubs and such-like. With capital of around £500,000 they have been running for some thirty years. They do not advertise so they're a well-kept secret. Their license ensures that your savings are protected up to the £85,000 limit that applies to all banks and building societies.
