Hope and Remembrance

few Sundays ago we started the service with prayers for the young girl who was involved in an accident on Northchurch High Street. We prayed for her parents, all those involved in her care and her school and friends. I think that in the community we are feeling a sense of shock and deep sadness.

As Hurricane Ophelia was battering Ireland in the middle of October there was an unusual sky over this part of the country. Someone remarked to me that it must be the "end of days" as the light was reflected by the phenomenon of a red sun. I'm not sure about that but in conversations with people and looking at news reports there is at the present time a huge sense of uncertainty about what the

future holds. No one can really predict what will happen in the next two years with the European negotiations and there are serious doubts being raised whether the American administration is best placed to take a lead in complex international relations. When you start making a list of other things such as climate change and terrorism incidents it soon can become very disheartening.

November is the month of remembrance and a time to reflect on what previous generations had to face and get through. Events have been held to mark the 100th anniversary of the Battle of Passchendaele where over a three month period there were nearly 585,000 Allied and German casualties. It was known as the Battle of Mud and encapsulated the brutality and horror of the war. On Remembrance Sunday after the service in St Mary's we will gather around the War Memorial for the Two Minute Silence.

From a faith perspective there is always a focus on love and hope............ There has to be a resilient determination that these values will shine through the darkness.

Whatever the challenges of the present time we have to face them with courage and compassion. In the silence by the War Memorial, I generally focus on two things: the wonder, beauty and vibrancy of the world and also the recognition that it is sadly marred by violence, terror and the misuse power. generation there have been those who have made a stand for

justice, peace and reconciliation. We also have to respond to that challenge and take on its responsibilities. From a faith perspective there is always a focus on love and hope and in the context of today's world there has to be a resilient determination that these values will shine through the darkness.

Northchurch Allotments: A potted history

1830-1880: Sir John Hobart Culme-Seymour came from a distinguished family of naval commanders, admirals and vice-admirals and was appointed Rector of St Mary's Church Northchurch in 1830 by the Duchy of Cornwall who owned the land. He was also a Canon of both Lincoln and Gloucester Cathedrals. He built the rectory and St John's Church, Bourne End, where he was buried.

The rector rented out land to parishioners with numerous regulations for the allotment holders on church land including regular church attendance, not gardening on his masters time and keeping the ground in good condition by digging and applying manure.



Earl Brownlow purchased the manor of Ashridge from the Duchy of Cornwall in 1860.

Ordnance Survey of 1877 shows the boundaries of our current allotments

The Northchurch parish council was collecting rents for the allotments in 1901



The parish council leased land for allotments from Earl Brownlow 1915 to 1931

The parish council borrowed £1,000 to purchase the allotments and land for the recreation ground in 1924

1924 (and thereafter) the allotment plots are marked allotment gardens

The allotments have a long history; they were busy during two World Wars; they are still going strong. It is great to garden on soil that has been tended over 140 years. Three or four plots are likely to fall vacant this autumn so if you are a keen gardener and would like to join us the way forward is to contact the Parish Clerk in the first instance and put your name on the waiting list.

Lieutenant John Augustus 'Jack' HARMAN

Royal Flying Corps

Jack Harman, the grandson of Revd. Augustus Birch, a former Rector of St Mary's Northchurch, was born in London in 1893. A keen rugby player, in early 1914 Jack emigrated to Ceylon to begin a new life as a tea farmer. The war changed Jack's plans and returned to England in 1915, gaining a Commission in the Army Service Corps.

Jack served with the ASC in Egypt and Salonika before requesting a transfer to the Royal Flying Corps to train as a pilot. In January 1917, his training started at the $|\operatorname{Photo}$ supplied by Charles Harman RFC's flying schools in Egypt

17th November 1917

and he graduated the following May. Jack applied for a home posting – he wanted to shoot down Zeppelins.

Zeppelin attacks on the British mainland had started in 1915 and had gradually increased in number. Initially impervious to attack by British fighters, it was not until 1916 that incendiary bullets were developed to tear open the Zeppelin's outer cover and penetrate their hydrogen gas cells.

With the RFC beginning to gain the upper hand, the Germans introduced larger Zeppelins that could reach 20,000ft, higher than the RFC fighters could fly, but at the cost of a smaller payload of bombs. In response, the British planes were altered, changing them from a twoman crew to one, and replacing heaver material with lighter items, thus enabling them to climb higher.

On the night of 17th November 1917, Jack took off from his base in Lincolnshire ready for the predicted Zeppelin



THE GREAT WAR 1914 1918 attack. Jack's plane crashed shortly afterwards, killing him instantly. The subsequent Court of Inquiry later heard that his aircraft was in a satisfactory state at the time of the crash and concluded that Jack's death was the result of a night flying accident caused by pilot error.

News from Herts CC Councillor: Terry Douris

I was privileged to be invited to the presentation of the Bainbridge Trophy to Alan Fantham in recognition of his tireless work for Northchurch. He cares passionately for the village holding me to account but he is rightfully known as 'Mr Northchurch'. He was genuinely surprised on the evening and well done to everyone for keeping it a secret.

As I write this it is the end of the Libraries Week initiative and I set out to visit during the week all 46 libraries that Hertfordshire has and I succeeded by 1.30pm on Saturday 14th. Like all areas of the County Council libraries have had to make savings to contribute to the overall savings required across the county. We have done this by opening at the most popular hours in each library and whilst we have sadly terminated the mobile library service we have replaced this with the home library service providing a delivery service direct to the door for those who cannot get to the library.

Once of the key features that I am aware of is the wide variety of types of library ranging from the busiest in St Albans, the innovative like the new library in The Forum in Hemel Hempstead to the very small library like Stevenage Old Town. If you have not visited a library in the recent past you may be surprised at what you find. Many libraries feature special 'Rhyme Time' reading sessions for young children, there is a wide range of other facilities. You can out more at www.hertfordshire.gov.uk and click on the libraries box.

This is all part of our Inspiring Libraries programme and a new innovation that we have been trialling is Open+ which allows Library users with a special access card to access their library when it would otherwise be closed. At the moment it is only available at Croxley Green Library and only certain libraries will be suitable.

I am delighted that our Hertfordshire Archives and Local Studies which is situated at County Hall and open to the public very recently obtained its formal re-accreditation. It contains a fascinating range of historical documents with one dating from 1060 nearly a thousand years old!

Finally, the sad and untimely death of the Leader of Hertfordshire Council Cllr Robert Gordon was a great shock to all of us. Robert was widely respected by everyone who knew him irrespective of political views and he will be greatly missed.
