Dethroning Mammon: Making money serve Grace

This year Lent begins on March 1st with Ash Wednesday and through the following weeks on Thursday evenings (starting on March 2nd) at 8.00pm in the Parish Room there will be a Lent Course. Everyone is welcome and the theme will be the Archbishop of Canterbury's Lent Book "Dethroning Mammon: making Money Serve Grace." The course is a chance for some Bible Study, sharing of thoughts and experiences, so that we can reflect together on the journey of Jesus to the cross and resurrection.

In the foreword to the book there is a reference to someone who had no religious faith asking what was Lent all about? The reply was that it was a time to think about all the poor and lonely people of the world, refugees and the elderly, prisoners and those controlled by addiction. It is a time for addressing the barriers that divide us from one another. The person responded if that was the case it was a good idea.

The Archbishop's book does focus on the divide between the poor and the rich, and suggests that this has become so deep and wide that we have lost sight of what life is like for millions who don't have many of the things that we can easily take for granted. Yet, in the modern world many of the decisions about how we live as consumers has a resounding effect upon everyone in the planet. The book asks the question of what are the forces that control how we live. Mammon is the name given by Jesus to the power held over individuals by economics, by money and the flow of finance. The more we let ourselves be

governed by Mammon, the more power it has and the more the vulnerable suffer.

The book and course will explore the contrast between following Jesus and following Mammon. The author argues that money plays a part in many human crises, in particular debt and a desire for things that can enslave us. At a national and international level, "every crisis seems to end in talk about economics — not economics as a tool in the service of human flourishing, but as an end in itself." When finances are in good order, at a personal or national level, then the focus tends not to see this as a means to improve people's lives, "but as the goal in the pursuit of a good life." This approach the author argues is incompatible with serving Christ.

You may think that is true or total nonsense. A Lent Group is a great way to share ideas in a place where viewpoints are respected and valued. The room and welcome will be warm and refreshments will be provided.





This Month In March 1874

Early one Monday morning in March 1874, a scene took place in an empty Berkhamsted High Street which would be unheard of today. On that morning, an agricultural labourer called George Randall, the 20-year-old son of James Randall of New Road in Northchurch, the Sexton and a bellringer at St Mary's church, was driving two oxen down the High Street towards Northchurch. They both belonged to Mrs Ann Ashby, the Northchurch butcher who had her shop in the High Street. It was not long before some local boys saw the approaching oxen and, in search removed their fun, brightly-coloured handkerchiefs from their pockets and started waving them in an attempt to frighten the oxen. The result was predictable; in an agitated state, one of the oxen panicked and George Randall lost control. The ox started to run off, knocking over a small boy who was on his way to school. Attempting to save the boy from further injury George Randall himself fell over and hit his head heavily on a stone. Had not a man named Cook come onto the scene at this crucial time and pulled George Randall away he might have been killed. Eventually other men managed to capture the ox and secured it in Lane's nursery. The Ox was then taken to the meadow by Lagley House in Gossoms End where it was killed. Although severely injured by his fall, George Randall subsequently made a full recovery.


