Fund Raising and Church Life

Over the last year at St Mary's a number of events have taken place as part of the "Raise the Roof" fund raising appeal. If the wind is in a certain direction and it is raining heavily there can be leaks in the roof and one or two buckets are required to collect the raindrops. There have been a number of events that have included musical concerts, social evenings and in early December the Christmas Market. The organising committee are working very hard and events are already in place for 2017. Fund raising and stewardship is a challenge for churches. The money that is raised for the running costs and expenses of the church are the responsibility of the congregation as there is no council or government help. There are organisations that can provide grants for building work but the pot of funds is small. There is also the awareness that there are many demands on individual's and families' finances.

In the Gospels it is interesting that Jesus does speak about money. As an example he tells parables about rich farmers, he notices a poor widow who gives everything she has to the temple, and he even suggests that you cannot serve God and money. If that is the case then there is a danger money might get in the way of being a disciple. There is a story of rich man who wants to follow Jesus and he is told to sell all he has and give to the poor. He can't do it and that is very understandable. When this passage comes up in sermons it is often watered down to suggest that

Jesus was speaking to the individual rather than making a universal point. Yet, it does seem clear that following Jesus is tough and it can ask of us demanding choices.

Martin Luther, the Sixteenth Century German reformer, remarked that conversion consists of three parts: conversion of your heart, conversion of your mind and conversion of your purse. In all three cases, the conversion consists from turning away from a focus on oneself towards a focus on God and neighbour. Maybe Jesus knew that there are few more important things than what we do with money as it is generosity that can make such a difference to other people. I don't think Jesus asked the rich man to sell all he owned and give to the poor just to ruin his day. It was a loving response to a question that he had been asked. What choices we make with money can define who we are and what we can become. He asks him to give away what he has to the poor and he can choose how that should be done.

Church fund raising is not just about maintaining a building. It is much more about the life of the church and supporting what it does, its giving to local and international charities. In giving to a church it is more than supporting an institution but a way of participating in what God is doing with a community of people that is not closed but welcomes all.





Life after death—in the New Testament

In my last contribution to this column, I showed how there was little direct teaching about the gift of immortality to faithful believers in the Old Testament. There are, however, many clues and links with resurrection as the gateway to immortality as the heritage of believers.

In the New Testament, things are clearer because Jesus Christ, himself a man (though son of God), has overturned death and been raised to immortality by God. He now proposes to share his immortality with those who follow him.

The testimony of the Apostle Paul is powerful: 2Timothy1,vs.4-7 *I have finished my course, I have kept the faith....... I now await the garland of righteousness* (a metaphor) *which the Lord, the righteous judge, will give*

me on the great day, and not to me alone but to all who have set their hearts on his coming appearance.

Such passages abound in the New Testament, and you can find them by reading the whole New Testament making a note of references to *the great day* (and many similar phrases).

If you are a follower of Jesus, however weak your efforts may appear, by his gracious forgiveness you can hope to be among those who are waiting for the great day of fulfilment.

Peter (1Peter1,vs 7) speaks of the great faith by which we should live lives worthy of praise, glory and honour, when Jesus Christ is revealed.

WOMEN'S WORLD DAY OF PRAYER

(INTERNATIONAL AND INTERDENOMINATIONAL)

On Friday 3rd March over 5,000 services will be held in the British Isles on the theme of 'Am I Being Unfair to You?' The Christian women of the Philippines wrote the service and it has been translated into 1,000 different languages and dialects, to be used, throughout the whole world, on Friday 3rd March, starting at sunrise over the island of Samoa and continuing until sunset off the coast of American Samoa.

In 2013, Typhoon Haiyan – named locally as 'Yolanda' – struck the Philippine islands in the western Pacific Ocean. This is mentioned in the service but you will also hear the

stories of a girl, a mother and an older woman, recounting their situations and their hopes and fears. The service focusses on the Bible story of the workers in the vineyard: Matthew 20 v 1-16. There is a reflection on the artwork designed by Rowena 'Apol' Laxamana-Sta.Rosa. It is very thought provoking and illustrates contrasting scenes.

2nd Lieutenant Royden Spencer Bayspool PORTER

2nd Battalion, Infantry (Territorial Force)
Honourable Artillery Company
Killed 6th February 1917



THE GREAT WAR 1914 - 1918 Royden Spencer Bayspool Porter came from Sydenham and was the son of George Bayspool Porter, a partner in a firm of solicitors in London. Not surprisingly, on completing his education, Royden became an articled clerk and later a solicitor with his father's firm.

In October 1914, Royden enlisted with the Honourable

Artillery. Royden moved quickly up the ranks, appointed Lance Corporal on Boxing Day 1914, Acting Corporal a few days later and promoted to Acting Sergeant the following March. Royden was commissioned into 2nd Battalion, Infantry, HAC the following October.

Royden and his Battalion left England in October 1916 and were soon in the trenches in the area fought over during the recently-ended Battle of the Somme. Over the coming months rain, snow and harassing fire from German artillery made life in the trenches unbearable. Soldiers were constantly wet with the trenches often half-full of mud and water. Personal hygiene was practically impossible and many went down with a new condition called 'trench foot'.

January 1917 saw a German shell bursting in the battalion's cookhouse killing or wounding several men and destroying all the battalion's stores, rations and utensils. Soon afterwards the battalion withdrew from the front line but by then, Royden was displaying symptoms of typhoid. He was transferred to a military hospital, but died on 6th February, aged 26. His headstone bears the text, 'For ever with the Lord'. It was chosen by his parents who had by then moved to Fendley House in Cow Roast, requesting that their son's name be included on the Northchurch War Memorial.


Northchurch Parish Council News
