Private 75902 Charles Thomas MASHFORD

Royal Fusiliers (City of London Regiment) attached to 2/2nd (City of London) Battalion, The London Regiment. Killed 24th April 1918

Charlie Mashford, was born in Northchurch in 1899. In 1911, Charlie was living in Eddy Street in Gossoms End with is parents and younger sister. Charlie's father died suddenly in 1914 and 15-year-old Charlie became the sole means of support for his mother and sister.

In the spring of 1917, Charlie was conscripted and joined the Royal Fusiliers. The following March, Charlie was rushed to France in a draft of 114 men and attached to $2/2^{nd}$ (City of London) Battalion, The London Regiment. Exactly one week earlier, the German army had launched their Spring Offensive, and was steadily reclaiming the territory it had relinquished during the battles of 1916 and

As the British losses escalated, they were forced back to well-prepared defences, miles behind the former front line, and it was here that Charlie joined what was left of his battalion. On 5th April, his battalion moved to Villers-Bretonneaux, close to the strategic town Amiens, one of the key objectives of the German offensive, where they dug further fall-back trenches ready for when the Germans launched their next attack.

The expected attack came early on 24th April, with an artillery barrage of high explosive and poison gas shells, followed by German Stormtroopers advancing though the morning mist supported, for the first time, by tanks. The German tanks were quickly engaged by British tanks and withdrew, but Charlie's battalion was surrounded on three sides. Charlie's body was found after the fighting had subsided and

was buried where he fell. He was just 19 years old and had been at the front for just twenty-eight days.

I looked over at the Alms Houses and it occurred to me - this was what Northchurch must have felt like before the car. I felt privileged to live in such an idyllic place, but also realised just how much the heavy traffic in the High Street impacts on our safety and the enjoyment of our village. As promised in the campaign, improving road safety is my priority.

The morning after the election I joined Gareth Hawden and other members of the Go20 campaign, along with Terry Douris and members of the Parish Council to meet engineers from Hertfordshire County Council to discuss this very issue. It is likely to be a long process and I hope to help gather more evidence from the local community to support the campaign to improve road safety. I will work together with everyone concerned to improve road traffic safety for our families.

I have really enjoyed the campaign. The best bit has been the opportunity to meet so many of you. Behind the doors of Northchurch, there is a wealth of experience and talent. I have heard words of wisdom from residents who have lived here all their lives; I have met enthusiastic young people brimming with energy and ideas; I even had the privilege of being shown the Hedgehog's clock, rescued from the trenches of WW1! I am really looking forward to serving and meeting even more of you over the coming months.
